Abstracts are limited to 400 words or less using the template provided below. Podium abstracts must report on completed projects; or present theoretical or legislative issues. Abstracts for proposed or in process projects will be reviewed for poster presentation. The deadline for submission of Abstracts is December 24, 2008.

Learning Objectives must be described (Learning Objectives WILL NOT be included in the abstract text word count). Each contributed paper must be categorized under one of the topics or areas of interest described in the call for papers. Deadlines for submitting abstracts are listed below. Authors are encouraged to submit abstracts on current and emerging rural health issues.

You do not need to be an RNO member to submit an abstract. However, **if your abstract is accepted for presentation you MUST become an RNO Individual member and you MUST register for the Conference**. Submission of an abstract implies a commitment to make the presentation at the annual meeting. All authors will be notified via email of abstract status during the last week of January 2009. Please make sure your email address is correct.

The abstracts being submitted should not be presented or published prior to the RNO Conference in June 2009.
